Frank Standaert, Funeral services for Frank Standaert, who died suddenly on Thursday [[morning?]] at his home will be held on Monday, June 27 from his late residence, at [[356?]] East Nineteenth street, at 8:30 a.m. A High Requiem Mass will be celebrated at Our Lady of Lourdes church a half hour later. Interment will be made in Holy Sepulchre cemetery in the family plot. Mr. Standaert was born in Holland and came to Paterson 42 years ago. He was a member of Our Lady of Lourdes church and his many friends were shocked at the news of his sudden death. Residing in the Riverside section of Paterson the greater part of his life, Mr.Standaert devoted his spare moments to the hobby of raising prime racing pigeons.
